



## JUST/2013/JPEN/AG/4475 – *Enhancing European judicial cooperation*

The Public Prosecutor's Office attached to the High Court of Cassation and Justice has obtained the necessary funding in order to implement the project **JUST/2013/JPEN/AG/4475 „Enhancing European judicial cooperation”**. The Directorate-General for Justice grants the funding through the 2013 Criminal Justice programme.

This project has a 24-month time span, a budget of 410.512,48 euros and will be implemented together with the following partners:

- The Spanish Public Prosecutor's Office
- The Swedish Public Ministry
- The Public Prosecutor's Office of Saxony
- British Council Romania
- Cervantes Institute Romania
- Goethe Institute Romania

The structure of the project **„Enhancing European judicial cooperation”- JUST/2013/JPEN/AG/4475** consists of three activities:

### **Activity 1: delivery of foreign language courses to 80 employees from the Public Ministry (prosecutors, court clerks, public officials)**

- 50 persons will attend the English language courses organized by the British Council Romania
- 15 persons will attend the Spanish language courses organized by Cervantes Institute in Romania
- 15 persons will attend the German language courses organized by Goethe Institute in Romania

**Activity 2: traineeships within the partner countries involved in the project, with the aim of enhancing judicial cooperation.** The partner countries involved in this project are: Spain, Sweden and Germany.

- 5 prosecutors who attended the English language courses will be able to take part in a two-week traineeship in Sweden, at the Public Prosecutor's Offices in Gothenburg and Malmö.
- 5 prosecutors who attended the Spanish language courses will be able to take part in a two-week traineeship at various Public Prosecutor's Offices in Spain.
- 5 prosecutors who attended the German language courses will be able to take part in a two-week traineeship at the Public Prosecutor's Office of Saxony, in Germany.
- 15 prosecutors will be invited to Romania to take part in a two-week traineeship: five Swedish prosecutors, five Spanish prosecutors and five German prosecutors.

### **Activity 3: development of a manual comprising a comparative analysis of the instruments for cooperation employed by the countries participating in this project.**

This manual will be edited in English and translated into Spanish, Swedish, German and Romanian. Finally, at the end of the project a round table will be organized to disseminate the manual and present the results of the project.
