Our policy is therefore that cheating is not tolerated, and we will not release a result if we have reasonable grounds to suspect that it is not a reliable indicator of a candidate's ability.

Cheating in examinations is on the increase globally, and we have therefore developed a number of strategies in the fight against it:

- All test centre staff are trained to detect malpractice during test administrations.
- We use a series of sophisticated statistical analysis methods to check unusual patterns in test responses.
- Where we suspect that malpractice may have taken place, cases are carefully scrutinised both by our staff and by independent malpractice experts. We always employ human judgement in our decisions and do not rely on statistical analysis alone.

It can take up to two months for a suspected malpractice case to be concluded, which means that sometimes results will be delayed. We understand this may cause frustration, but we hope that our learners appreciate the importance of carrying out a thorough investigation so the result they receive is a reliable and valid indicator of their English ability.




